WHAT IS PRAYER?

• What prayer isn't....

- ... a coin for vending machine to put a prayer in and pull.
- ... a way to present God with a wish as if he was a genie
- ... a way to bargain/plead with God to get what you want
- ... a "get-rich-quick" or "name-it-and-claim-it" system
- ... a measurement of piety or righteousness to impress
- ... something only the most righteous people can do
- ... a substitute for human responsibility

Any of these, and others, brings God to our level and insults His character and who He is

What prayer is...

- ... a way to commune and communicate with God
- ... a means to offer praise and gratitude to God for who He is and all that He has done and continues to do for us
- ... a means to bring ourselves into the presence of God so that His character and presence can give us strength in the moment and fill us
- ... a personal, two-way conversation with the Almighty that involves expressing our concerns and listening for His response
- ... seeking the mind of God on a particular matter that's on our heart
- ... connecting with God in order to transfer His Will into our life
- ... collaborating with God to accomplish His Will and purpose

Prayer is the conversation that turns salvation into a close personal relationship with God
